Hoewel Caesar nog altijd geldt als onoverwinnelijke generaal, kost het hem steeds meer moeite de corruptie, complotten en conflicten die de Romeinse politiek beheersen in te dammen. Zijn macht begint af te nemen, en hij stevent onherroepelijk af op het moment dat de Romeinse geschiedenis voor altijd zal veranderen. De adelaar is een politieke thriller en een rijkgeschakeerd historisch fresco waarin alle bekende protagonisten uit de Romeinse geschiedenis, zoals Brutus, Marcus Antonius, Cicero en Cleopatra, een rol spelen.
